

CRHR referee assessment criteria

Referee assessments are split into 5 areas:

- Pre Match
- Attitude
- Authority
- Application of rules
- Post Match

Each area then has individual scores. Each of these are graded 1 to 5, with a total score out of 120. A score of 80 or above can be considered for upgrade.

Each score is as follows:

- Pre Match
 - Uniform
 - 1 point each for correct shirt, trousers, shoes, good whistle, looking presentable
 - Goal nets
 - 2 points for checking before the game, 2 points for checking before the 2nd half, 1 point extra for doing both
 - Registrations
 - 2 points for checking each team, 1 point extra for doing both
 - Match sheet
 - 3 points for a quick look through. 5 points for detailed look through and talking to timekeepers
 - Line up
 - 1 point neither teams checked, 3 points one team checked, 5 points both teams checked and correct
- Attitude
 - Other referee
 - 1 point for not working as a team, 3 points for some teamwork, but not constant and through all areas. 5 points for working well as a team, good movement, good discussions, consistent.
 - Timekeepers
 - 1 point for not really working with the timekeepers. 3 points for sometimes working with the timekeepers. 5 points for constantly working with the timekeepers through the game.
 - Players
 - 1 point if any aggression or a bad attitude. 3 points for trying to communicate with players, no bad attitude. 5 points for great communication with players, good relationship
 - Coaches

- 1 point if any aggression or a bad attitude. 3 points for trying to communicate with coaches, no bad attitude. 5 points for great communication with coaches, good relationship
- Authority
 - Demeanour
 - 1 point if looks nervous or not interested. 3 points for mostly looking confident. 5 points for always looking confident and in control
 - Hand signals
 - 1 point if majority of signals aren't clear. 3 points if a lot of signals are clear. 5 points if all of signals are clear.
 - Whistling
 - 1 point for weak whistling, no strength or variation. 3 points for mostly strong whistles with some variation. 5 points for always strong whistle, with different volumes and strength for every time it's needed.
 - Handling dissent
 - 1 point for letting clear dissent go unpunished, or gets into arguments. 3 points for handling most of dissent, doesn't get into any arguments. 5 points for handling all dissent well.
- Application of rules
 - Positioning
 - 1 point for never being in the right position. 3 points for mostly being in the right position. 5 points for always in the right position, always ahead of the play, great movement.
 - Monitoring defensive zone
 - 1 point for not looking in the right areas most of the time. 3 points for mostly looking in the right areas. 5 points for always looking in the right always, always keeping track of all players, the ball and other referee.
 - Monitoring attacking zone
 - 1 point for not looking in the right areas most of the time. 3 points for mostly looking in the right areas. 5 points for always looking in the right always, always keeping track of all players, the ball and other referee.
 - Technical Fouls
 - 1 point for majority of technical fouls missed or incorrectly called. 3 points for a good amount called correctly. Decent interpretations on high sticks, kicking the ball etc. 5 points for all fouls given being correct, consistent interpretations.
 - Team Fouls
 - 1 point for majority of team fouls missed. 3 points for good amount given , but still letting the game flow and nothing dangerous left unpunished. 5 points for great game flow, calling all fouls at the best time.
 - Advantage
 - 1 point for decisions being incorrect, either letting go too much or not giving advantage at all. 3 points for most advantage decision being correct. 5 points for great game flow, nothing dangerous left, good communication doing it.
 - Direct Free Hits

- 1 point for missed all DFH decisions, or incorrect procedure. 3 points for forgetting most of the decisions, good procedure. 5 points for getting all decisions correct, correct procedure.
 - Penalty Shots
 - 1 point for missed all PS decisions, or incorrect procedure. 3 points for forgetting most of the decisions, good procedure. 5 points for getting all decisions correct, correct procedure.
 - Consistency
 - 1 point for not being consistent through the match. 3 points for mostly being consistent between both teams. 5 points for being consistent with both teams, in both halves.
- Post Match
 - Policing conduct
 - 1 point if they left the rink before the teams. 3 for staying on the rink but not policing the teams, or if left separate to other referee. 5 points for policing both teams well, and leaving the rink as a team.
 - Signing match sheet
 - 1 point for not ensuring captains signed, or not signed themselves. 3 points for signing but before the captains. 5 points for both captains signed, sheet checked against referee notes, and signed.
